Agenda Item 5 – A: Princeton Review SAT and ACT Preparation

The Garden Grove Unified School district has had an ongoing agreement with Princeton Review for the past ten years to prepare for the SAT and ACT at all high schools. This agreement includes on-campus SAT and ACT preparation courses for 11<sup>th</sup> grade students that will prepare them for the March SAT and April ACT exams. Each course includes classroom lecture and several full-length practice exams. Students will also have access to online test preparation resources. In addition, consultants will provide each high school participant with the SAT or ACT Student Kit. For the 2016-17 school year, the cost will remain the same (\$118 per student of which the district will fund \$68 per student).

As a pilot program, the cost for the 2016-17 school year is \$4,000 for two high schools, Rancho Alamitos and Santiago. If the pilot program is successful, it will be implemented at other district schools.

On August 9, 2016, the Board adopted Resolution No. 8 – Ordering of Election to Authorize Issuance of School Bonds. On November 8, 2016, the Bond Election for Measure P was duly held and passed with more than 55 percent of the votes cast in favor of issuing general obligation bonds on behalf of the Garden Grove Unified School District in the amount of \$311 million for school facilities improvement purposes. The Certificate of Election Results has been received from the Orange County Registrar of Voters indicating that 76.3 percent (58,962) voted in favor of Measure P.

The Board is required to take action to certify the election results and all proceedings in the November 8, 2016, General Obligation Bond Election, and submit the Resolution to the County Superintendent of Schools and the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of Orange County. The existing independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee is affirmed to be the independent citizens' bond oversight committee for Measure P.

Agenda Item 6 – B: Resolution No. 17 – Dedication of Easement at Pacifica High School Campus to the City of Garden Grove for Public Street Purposes

Pursuant to Education Code Section 17556 et seq., the district may dedicate an easement at its Pacifica High School property to the City of Garden Grove for public street and highway purposes, which includes sidewalks abutting the campus. The process provides for 1) the adoption of a resolution declaring its intent to dedicate, which must be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the Board; 2) notice of the adoption of the resolution and the time and place of a public hearing; 3) a public hearing; and 4) adoption of a second resolution dedicating the easement, which must be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the Board.

On December 13, 2016, the Board unanimously adopted Resolution No. 15 entitled, "Intent to Dedicate an Easement for Public Street Purposes to the City of Garden Grove." On January 6, 2017, the district gave public notice of the public hearing to be held on January 17, 2017, to receive public comment and consider whether the dedication is in the best interests of the district.

The City of Garden Grove seeks the Garden Grove Unified School District's dedication of a portion of the Pacifica High School campus, in the form of a Dedication of Easement to the City in exchange for the city's continued operation and maintenance of the easement as a portion of Knott Street. The easement will convey a right turn pocket to widen the area at the Knott Street parking lot entryway to the campus to ease the flow of traffic for all vehicles. District staff has confirmed that the easement area is not needed for classroom buildings.

It is recommended that the Board approve Resolution No. 17 dedicating an easement at the Pacifica High School campus to the City of Garden Grove for public street purposes.

Effective October 12, 1994, the State of California approved the use of California Multiple Award Schedules (CMAS) by local governments (i.e. city, county, district, or other local governmental body empowered to expend public funds) for information technology products and services. Using a CMAS contract would be a cost-effective manner of procurement for new synthetic track surfacing.

Public Contract Code Sections 20118 et al. provide that the governing board of any school district, without advertising for bids, may authorize any public agency to purchase equipment and services for its use in the manner in which the public agency is authorized by law to make such purchases. The State of California authorized school districts to purchase product and services from FieldTurf USA, Inc. on the California Multiple Award Schedules in accordance with the same specifications, terms, and conditions. The State of California CMAS contract is valid from October 7, 2016, through November 30, 2021.
