Agenda Item 6 – A: Resolution No. 19 – Emergency Roof Repairs at Jordan Adult Transition Program School

Pursuant to statutory authority in cases of emergency, including the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (Public Contract Code Sections 22035 and 22050), the district is authorized to procure without bidding certain services and work that must be expeditiously performed to mitigate damage, secure public safety, and to ensure the district's ability to provide essential public services, including the continuance of existing school classes. At the earliest possible date that conditions warrant, the Board must terminate the emergency action so that any remaining work may be completed by giving notice for bids to let contracts. Accordingly, since the repair and replacement will be complete by the Board date, the conditions warrant terminating the emergency action.

On or about December 16, 2016, it was discovered that there were several leaks in Building A at Jordan Adult Transition Program School. The roof leaks posed an immediate risk to life, property, and ongoing operations at the school, requiring a complete tear off and replacement of the roof, as well as replacement of the HVAC units. Additionally there is water damage inside the building that requires remediation and repair. Four vendors have provided estimates to complete the roofing, mechanical, HVAC, and interior rehabilitation scope:

Circle City Electric, Inc.	\$19,600
Franklin Mechanical Systems, Inc.	\$80,900
JL Cobb Construction	\$15,000
Letner Roofing Co.	\$93,746

The total anticipated cost of the emergency work is \$209,246. The emergency repairs have begun and the repairs will be complete on or before February 21, 2017.

Agenda Item 6 – C: Authorization to Participate in the Western States Contracting Alliance – Purchase of Data Communications Products and Services (Master Price Agreement No. AR233; California Participating Addendum No. 7-14-70-04)

Public Contract Code Sections 10298, 10299, and 12100 provide that the governing board of any school district, without advertising for bids, may authorize any public agency to purchase equipment and services for its use in the manner in which the public agency is authorized by law to make such purchases. The State of California authorized school districts to purchase products and services from vendors listed on the Western States Contracting Alliance (WSCA) in accordance with the same specifications, terms, and conditions.

The district requires licenses and services for the Voice over Internet Protocol (VOIP). The State of Utah, in association with the National Association of State Procurement Officials and the WSCA, awarded Master Price Agreement No. AR233 to Cisco Systems, Inc. (Resilient Communications, Inc., as an authorized reseller under California Participation Addendum No. 7-14-70-04). Using a WSCA contract would be a cost-effective manner of procurement for information technology and services for licenses and services for the district's VOIP system. The State of California WSCA contract with Cisco Systems, Inc. (Resilient Communications, Inc. as an authorized reseller) is valid through May 31, 2019.
