Agenda Item 6 – C: Authorization to Participate in the California Multiple Award Schedule – Purchase of Non-Information Technology Products and Services (Contract No. 4-13-73-0024A)

Effective October 12, 1994, the State of California approved the use of California Multiple Award Schedules (CMAS) by local governments (i.e. city, county, district, or other local governmental body empowered to expend public funds) for non-information technology products and services. Using a CMAS contract would be a cost-effective manner of procurement for information technology products and services.

Public Contract Code Sections 20118 et al. provide that the governing board of any school district, without advertising for bids, may authorize any public agency to purchase equipment and services for its use in the manner in which the public agency is authorized by law to make such purchases. The State of California has authorized school districts to purchase product and services from Advantage West Government Products Solutions (Contract No. 4-13-73-0024A) in accordance with the same specifications, terms, and conditions. The State of California CMAS Contract No. 4-13-73-0024A with Advantage West Government Products Solutions is valid from May 10, 2016, through September 30, 2021.
