Agenda Item 5 – A: Memorandum of Understanding Between the University of Southern California and the Garden Grove Unified School District for the Southern California College Advising Corps Program

The Southern California College Advising Corps pilot program, administered by the Center for Enrollment Research, Policy, and Practice (CERPP) at the University of Southern California (USC), will place recent graduates with a bachelor's degree to serve as college advisers to three of our district high schools. The three high schools, Garden Grove, Los Amigos, and Santiago, were selected to participate based on their high rates of students who qualify for free/reduced lunch program and are at risk of not meeting a-g requirements. The program's advisers will work in collaboration with district school counselors, teachers, and administrators to increase college-going rates in the schools they serve. Advisers provide admissions and financial-aid counseling to students and their families through one-on-one and group sessions. The program aims to increase the number of low-income, first-generation, and underrepresented students entering and completing higher education. There is no cost to the district.

It is recommended that the Board grant permission to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with USC so they may provide Advising Corps services to Garden Grove, Los Amigos, and Santiago high schools for the 2013-14 school year.

Agenda Item 5 – B: Supplemental Educational Services for Title I Students

Supplemental educational services are a requirement of the No Child Left Behind Act for all program improvement schools. Supplemental educational services are additional academic instruction designed to increase the academic achievement of students in Program Improvement schools. These services are provided to students from low-income families who are attending Title I schools that are in year two or more of Program Improvement. Supplemental educational services may include academic assistance such as tutoring, remediation, and other educational interventions that are consistent with the content and instruction used by the district and aligned with the state's academic content standards. Supplemental educational services must be provided outside of the regular school day by state-approved providers.

The Garden Grove Unified School District has been self-insured for Workers' Compensation since January 1979 and self-administered since October 1993.

Section 3702.6 of the Labor Code requires each public self-insurer of Workers' Compensation to advise its governing board, within 90 days of submission of the self-insurer's annual report, of the total liability shown on that report. The self-insurer's annual report covers the 2012-13 year and reports total liabilities of \$8,596,385. Current funding of these liabilities is in compliance with the requirements of the Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Publication 10.
