On October 10, 2010, the Board of Education established the Measure A Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (BOC). The BOC is charged with verifying the lawful expenditure of bond funds authorized by Measure A approved by voters in June 2010. The BOC is comprised of members representing parents, business, senior citizens, school-parent organizations, and several at-large representatives. The committee is required to submit an annual written report to the Board, in public session, with a statement whether the district is in compliance with the requirements of Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution, and a summary of the committee's proceedings and activities for the preceding year. The Annual Report reflects activity for the fiscal period of July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2013.

The BOC advises the public that the district is in compliance with Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution. Bond proceeds have been expended on projects set forth in the ballot measure. No proceeds have been used for teacher or administrative salaries or other school operating expenditures. Audits have been performed as prescribed by law.

It is recommended that the Board accept the July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2013, Annual Report from the Measure A Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee and the statement that the district is in compliance with Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution.
