Agenda Item 4 – A: Parent Infant Education and Support Program Income Agreement

Part C of IDEA states that families must be provided with information, skills, and support related to enhancing the skill development of their deaf infant. Parent education and support are important components of Early Start services and are the key to helping families make informed decisions during this crucial time in their child's development.

The Parent Infant Education and Support (PIES) program is an OCDE operated program that provides early intervention to families with children identified with hearing loss, birth to age three. The primary goal of the program is to assist the family in working with their children. This program was proposed and initiated in the district in 2002 as part of the mandated Universal Hearing Screening Program, and continues to the current school year.

Permission is requested for the district to renew the agreement with the Orange County Superintendent of Schools whereby the county will perform services with a family focus for the PIES program to provide developmental education, support and resources to empower parents to make informed decisions for their infant who is diagnosed with hearing loss.

Agenda Item 5 – A: 21st Century Community Learning Centers – High School After School Safety and Enrichment for Teens Program Grant

The 21st Century Community Learning Centers-Elementary and 21st Century High School After School Safety and Enrichment for Teens (ASSETs) Program grants were authorized under Title I, Part I of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act and amended by the passage of the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001. The purpose of these programs is to establish or expand community learning centers that provide safe and educationally enriching alternatives for children and teens during non-school hours. The 21st Century Programs are developed through partnerships between schools and community-based organizations such as the Boys and Girls Clubs of Garden Grove.

The Garden Grove Unified School District and the Boys and Girls Clubs of Garden Grove have received the grant for the 21st Century Community Learning Centers High School ASSETs program. The grant will add four new high school ASSETs programs at Bolsa Grande, Los Amigos, Santiago, and Rancho Alamitos high schools. The grant will provide \$880,000 in additional funding each year for a five-year period, 2014 through 2019, and \$80,000 towards Family Literacy. Billing for services provided by the Boys and Girls Clubs of Garden Grove will be submitted to the district every other month, beginning the first month of each fiscal year, in equal amounts, totaling six payments per year. Program expenditures will consist of three main categories: direct payroll related expenses totaling approximately 75 percent of overall expenses, direct program materials and supplies totaling approximately 10 percent of overall expenses, and support related expenses totaling approximately 15 percent of overall expenses. All expenditures follow the guidelines as set forth per the grant agreement and memorandum of understanding and are subject to audit.

Agenda Item 5 – B: College Board's Early Participation Program PSAT/NMSQT

The College Board Early Participation Program is an initiative to support the involvement of all students in the process of preparing for college at an earlier age. Students' earlier involvement in the PSAT/NMSQT program will also expose them to a wealth of college planning and preparation tools.

The College Board supports this initiative by providing districts with access to additional savings when districts pay to engage at least one grade of pre-junior students in taking the PSAT/NMSQT. The district has been participating in the program since 2007. The College Board Early Participation Program will serve up to 3,771 students at a rate of \$14 per student for the 2014-15 school year. This rate is reduced by 14 percent for all students enrolled in 10th grade. If approved, the district would offer this Early Participation Program to 10th grade students in the 2014-15 school year.

The State of California authorized school districts to purchase services from Epoch Universal, Inc.
