Agenda Item 4 – A: Resolution No. 16 – Authorization Request for Waiver of the Requirement that the Establishment of Trustee Areas and Adoption of a "By-Trustee Area" Election Process be Submitted to the Electors

The California Voting Rights Act (CVRA) was enacted in 2001, and took effect in 2002. The CVRA generally provides that "an at-large method of election may not be imposed or applied in a manner that impairs the ability of a protected class to elect candidates of its choice or its ability to influence the outcome of an election, as a result of the dilution or the abridgment of the rights of voters who are members of a protected class. . ." Since the district currently has no trustee areas, and an "at large" election system (i.e. all members of the Board are elected by all residents of the district), it is vulnerable to a legal challenge under the CVRA. This proposed action is one of a series of actions designed to ensure compliance with the CVRA or, at minimum, to avoid costly litigation alleging a violation of the CVRA.

At its regular meeting held on May 6, 2014, the Board adopted Resolution No. 28, authorizing and directing the superintendent to immediately initiate the legal and regulatory process to establish trustee areas within the district and to change the method of electing members of the Board in sufficient time for the new method of electing members of the Board be in place for the November 2016 election.

District staff, along with legal counsel and the Dolinka Group, implemented the initial steps of this transition by developing three (3) conceptual trustee area map scenarios for the Board to consider. At its regular meeting on August 19, 2014, the Board took action to send two of the trustee area scenarios out for public review and input. Information was available and input was received at community meetings on September 8, 10, 23, and 25, 2014, at a Regular Board Meeting on September 16, 2014, and online at the district's website. All input received has been provided to the Board.

At its meeting on October 21, 2014, the Board Adopted Resolution No. 11 initiating the process for changing election methodology to a by-trustee area method, adopting Scenario 2 as the trustee area map for the district, and recommending that the Orange County Committee on School District Organization approve and establish trustee areas from which district Board members will be elected in a by-trustee area election process.

In early 2015, the Orange County Committee on School District Organization will conduct a meeting within the Garden Grove Unified School District's boundaries and consider approval of the district's plan to transition to by-trustee area elections and established trustee areas from which district Board members will

be elected in a by-trustee area election process. Under law this action by the Orange County Committee on School District Organization would trigger an election to take place on the questions of the establishment of trustee areas and the election of Board members using a by-trustee area method of election, as required by Education Code sections 5019, 5020, 5021, and 5030.

This item is for the Board to consider, discuss, and adopt a resolution authorizing the district to seek a waiver from the California State Board of Education of the above-referenced election requirement to avoid the cost and uncertainty of an election on the questions and to complete the transition in a timely manner in order to guarantee that the new by-trustee area process will be in place in time to elect new board members at the Board's next regularly-scheduled election in 2016.

The State of California CMAS Contract No. 4-13-73-0024A with Advantage West Government Product Solutions is valid from September 9, 2013, through September 30, 2016.
