District

Under the provisions of Education Code Section 39806, reimbursement for transportation may be made to parents/guardians or designated individuals, who transport handicapped children to services or classes in public or private facilities, in lieu of district or chartered transportation, if such costs are less than would be incurred by district service.

Reimbursement to the parent/guardian or designated individual shall be at either the Internal Revenue Service rate per mile or a pre-determined amount, with payment to be in the form of a district check, payable on a monthly basis.

The round-trip distance or pre-determined amount shall be agreed upon by the parent/guardian and the Office of Special Education, and a monthly statement of mileage driven shall be submitted on either the appropriate district mileage form, or invoice. The parent shall sign a contract stating that a policy of insurance meeting district standards shall be carried during the term of the contract.

It is recommended that the Board approve reimbursement for mileage to parents/guardians of handicapped students or their designated individual for the transportation of students who are attending or receiving services at facilities or special education programs in lieu of district or chartered transportation for the 2015-16 school year, under provisions of Education Code Section 39806.

Agenda Item 4 - D: Waiver of California High School Exit Examination for Students with a Disability

At the request of a parent or guardian, a school principal shall submit a request to the Board of Education for a waiver of the requirement to pass the high school exit examination for a student with a disability who has taken the high school exit examination with modifications that alter what the test measures and has received the equivalent of a passing score on one or both subject matter parts of the examination.

The Board may waive the requirement to successfully pass one or both subject matter parts of the high school exit examination for a student with a disability, if the principal certifies to the Board that the student has all of the following:

- 1. An individualized education program (IEP) or Section 504 plan in place that requires modifications to be provided to the pupil when taking the high school exit examination.
- 2. Sufficient high school level course work, either satisfactorily completed or in progress, in a high school level curriculum sufficient to have attained the skills and knowledge otherwise needed to pass the high school exit examination.
- 3. An individual score report for the student showing that the student has received the equivalent of a passing score on the high school exit examination while using a modification that fundamentally alters what the high school exit examination measures as determined by the State Board of Education.

A "modification" is defined as any variation in the assessment environment or process that fundamentally alters what the test measures or affects the comparability of scores.

Legal Reference - Education Codes 60850 (f) (5) Definition of modification; 60851 (c) Waiver of the high school exit examination

The Education Code provides that retroactive salary and benefit payments may not be made unless the Board of Education reserves the right, prior to June 30 of the preceding year, to adopt such changed salaries and benefits during the following year.

It is recommended that the Board reserve the right to make retroactive salary and benefit changes (including appropriate reimbursements) for all employees, whether covered by negotiated agreements or not, pending the completion of negotiations and current studies of salary and the outcome of finance legislation.

All previously adopted salaries will remain in effect until/unless changed by the Board of Education, or through negotiated agreements. These changes would become effective on dates ordered by the Board.

It is recommended that the Board reserve the right to adopt retroactive changes in salaries and/or benefits during the 2015-16 school year for all employees, pending completion of negotiations and/or current studies of salaries and finance legislation.
